The Foreign Policy Association, organizer of the United States' largest international affairs learning program of its kind, will host the 9th annual Greater New York WorldQuest competition on March 16. Each high school team will consist of four students from Grades 9 through 12. All of the questions are multiple-choice except for Current Events, which will feature fill-in-the-blank, true/false, and open-ended questions. During a box-dinner break, students meet and learn about peers from other schools.

Prizes

First Place: The winning team and faculty adviser receive a trip to Washington, D.C., where they will compete with about 4,000 other students from winning regional teams in the April 23, 2016 National WorldQuest Competition. The National Competition weekend also features global affairs learning opportunities such as visits to embassies, expert presentations, and discussions on international relations careers, as well as many social activities.

Each member of the winning team also receives a \$100 cash prize.

Second Place: Each team member receives a \$50 cash prize. **Third Place:** Each team member receives a \$25 cash prize.

A high school team competition testing knowledge of global affairs

The 9th annual Greater New York WorldQuest competition will be held on Wednesday, March 16, 2016, from 4 to 7 PM at Stuyvesant High School.

Teams of four students in Grades 9 through 12 from each high school test their knowledge of global affairs during rounds of multiple-choice questioning. The three teams with the most correct answers receive prizes described below.



Who Sponsors WorldQuest?

What Are the WorldQuest Prizes?

First Place: The winning team and faculty adviser receive a trip to Washington, D.C., where they will compete with about 4,000 other students from winning regional teams in the April 26, 2014 National WorldQuest Competition. The National WorldQuest weekend also features global affairs learning opportunities such as visits to embassies, expert presentations, and discussions on international relations careers, as well as many social activities.

Each member of the winning team also receives a \$100 cash prize.

Second Place: Each team member receives a \$50 cash prize. **Third Place:** Each team member receives a \$25 cash prize.

How Do Teams Prepare for the Competition?

The Foreign Policy Association will provide competing teams with study resources and sample questions. Guidelines for faculty advisers also will be available.

The faculty adviser registers the team with the Foreign Policy Association, assists in preparing students for the competition, and travels to the competition with the team. The adviser to the winning team also prepares the team for the national competition and travels with the team to Washington, D.C.
