USEFUL INFORMATION

Location

The Magee campus is situated on a hillside overlooking the River Foyle in a mainly residential quarter of Londonderry. Northern Ireland's second city is famous, amongst other things, for its walls, a symbol of the city's rich legacy of history and tradition.

The city is a busy and expanding commercial centre which has been experiencing a sustained period of growth and regeneration; a process in which the University has played an important part. Derry is situated on the threshold of County Donegal, which is rightly famous for its wild and open beauty.

To the east of the city are the blue Sperrin Mountains and the lovely Roe Valley country park. The North West is served by excellent road and rail links, as well as a new airport.

Conference Fees

The standard fee for the conference is £160 UK Sterling. However for students and the unwaged there is a reduced fee of £130 UK Sterling. Please see the attached Booking Form for payment instructions.

The Conference fee includes accommodation and all the meals and refreshments indicated on the Programme.

Accommodation

In single ensuite rooms in Duncreggan Student Residence (5 min walk from Main Building). There are no shops on residence complex, but vending machines. Shops are located at the bottom of the Rock Rd (Campus main car park) (short walking distance).

Meals

Only the meals indicated in the programme are covered. For breakfast and lunch, vouchers will be provided at registration. Vegetarian options are always available. Please inform organisers of any other dietary requirements, we will endeavour to accommodate special requests.

Historical Tour of Derry/Londonderry Walls

Highly recommended with a local guide and an historical explanation that covers three centuries of history. Duration: 1 and a half hour ca. A nominal contribution from each participant will be collected during the course of the day. Wear walking shoes and bring an umbrella.

Travel Arrangements

From City of Derry Airport (Eglinton):

City of Derry airport is some 10 km from city centre (taxi from Derry City airport about £10-15 sterling), bus connections from/to the airport are not frequent and do not stop near the university quarters. Taxi sharing is appropriate in Airport-City of Derry runs. Taxi drivers mostly charge reduced fees for taxi sharing, ascertain with fellow travellers and taxi drivers.

Ryanair runs daily connections at an economic price from Stanstead Airport and the main UK destinations to City of Derry Airport. Please check www.Ryanair.com. Please also note Ryanair flights do not include food or drinks.

From Belfast

Belfast has two airports:

· Belfast International Airport (some 12 km from city centre) (taxi fare about £15 Sterling one way or bus fare about £6-7 Sterling one way) - good connection service to Belfast Victoria Bus Station every 20 minutes on week days and during the central hours of the day. Visit Ulsterbus for detailed info (web site at the bottom of this travel info part). International is also linked to the city of Derry via the Airporter Bus at the following times (price about £25 Sterling return):

9.00 am 10.00, 11.00, 13.00 pm, 15.00, 16.00, 17.00, 19.00, 21.00

· Belfast City Airport. Closer to Belfast city centre/Victoria bus station where you can catch a bus to City of Derry bus station. Belfast City Airport is also linked to Derry city centre by Airbus. This route proves more expensive but quickest (about £25 Sterling return). Airbus leaves City Airports at the following times:

8.15 am 9.15, 10.15, 12.15 pm, 14.15, 16.15, 18.15, 20.15

By bus:

From London: If you wish to travel overland for environmental or other reasons, you probably find interesting that 15-day advance purchase fare from London to Londonderry (via Dublin) by coach is 38 pounds; see www.nationalexpress.com/ Rather more luxurious train/ferry options are described at www.seat61.com/Northern-Ireland.htm

From Dublin: A daily bus service is also available from Busaras Bus Station in Dublin (Connolly Station)

From Belfast (Victoria Bus Station): service on the hour on weekdays (cost £11 Sterling return)(Derry city centre about 20 min walk from Magee Campus).

By train:

Trains from Belfast is an alternative route. It may require changeover. However, it is less convenient, as once arrived in the city of Derry, it leaves passengers on the other side of the river (Taxi are about £6-7 Sterling to Duncreggan Students Residence and a walking distance of about 35 min.). Enjoyable in good weather, with view of the city, direction city

centre over Craigavon Bridge.

For those travelling from Dublin by train. Enterprise service to Belfast on the hour.

By taxi:

Taxi from Derry/Londonderry bus station to Duncreggan Students Residence (Magee Campus-Univ. of Ulster) about £4 Sterling.
